Required information

- Your name
- O.C.A.S. application number or Durham College student number (100XXXXXX)
- Canadian or International applicant

Acceptable formats

- Total email size must be 10 mb or less
- Series of jpgs/scans
- Word document
- PDF document
- Link to a webpage

IMPORTANT: You should receive an email reply acknowledging the receipt of your portfolio within 1 week of it being submitted.

PORTFOLIO PIECES

1 Guidelines

- Your portfolio should show your current level of proficiency in drawing and visual arts.
- All submissions must be your own work. Any submission that contains plagiarized work, copied either manually or electronically, will be disqualified and you will be refused consideration.
- ♦ Do not include works of pre-existing characters, such as video game, comic book, cartoon, anime or manga characters.
- Any submission that contains inappropriate or offensive content will be refused consideration.

2 | Specific Requirements

- ◆ Your portfolio should include six (6) digital copies of your best work.
- Please include among the six the following:
 - a) An observational/traditional life drawing of a person (not a cartoon/character design), done in traditional materials (paper, pencil/pen/conte/charcoal, etc.).
 - b) An observational/traditional still-life drawing of objects, such as a bowl of fruit, flowers in a vase, arrangement of musical instruments, etc., done in traditional materials (paper, pencil/pen/conte/charcoal, etc.).
 - c) An observational/real-life drawing of interior of a building (such as a kitchen, classroom, washroom, etc.) OR an exterior view of a building, buildings or streetscape, done in traditional materials (paper, pencil/pen/conte/charcoal, etc.).
 - d) Three (3) **additional** pieces which can be from **any** medium, such as drawing, painting, sculpture, digital art (photoshop/illustrator), etc.
