


CAMPUS LIBRARY ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR IN REVIEW

ENRICHING THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

Re-purposed the library's fourth floor from a graduate student only to a silent study space made available to all Durham College and UOIT students. Since the change was made on October 1st, 2013, usage during peak periods has increased up to 500 percent.

FACILITATING ACCESS TO RESEARCH

The library continued **development of LibGuides**, an online informational and instructional tool of discipline specific research guides. The librarian-prepared guides introduce books and ebooks; journal databases; statistics and data sources; government and legal information; library evaluated websites; and media material. Explanatory information (e.g. What is a patent?) and links to "how to" research videos are also included.

ENHANCING ONLINE PRESENCE AND ACCESSIBILITY

Increased the number of **digital resources** to 81,415 ebooks, 59,550 ejournals, 100,530 electronic serial titles and 17,530 streaming videos.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION LITERACY

North Oshawa and Whitby Library locations had 492,566 visitors this year. Staff at the reference desk answered more than **3,600 reference questions** from Durham College students, faculty, and staff. **185 information literacy classes** were held reaching over **5,930 students**.


OUTREACH TO NEW AND PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

Campus Library supervised field placements for three Durham College Public Relations students, Tessa Ferrier, Lindsay Johnston and Alanna Cobb. As well, the library hosted four Durham College Library Technician students in the 1st year of their program.

COLLECTION HIGHLIGHTS

- Directed 50 percent of the funds alloted to media to purchase DVDs for Whitby Campus to support visual learning for courses including equipment assembly, operation and maintenance; and general industrial safety courses.
- Purchased new online resource, the complete set of American Society of Testing & Materials (ASTM)
 Standards, to support Whitby Campus programming and to supplement previously purchased Canadian Centre for Ontario Health & Safety (CCOHS) standards.
- ☐ Received a significant donation of horticulture books from Ruth Rodgers ranging from gardening history to garden design and plant selection.

REFERENCE AND INSTRUCTION

- Delivered library instruction classes to the School of Skilled Trades, Apprenticeship & Renewable Technology students covering topics such as: research skills and the literature review, use of research databases, and finding and evaluating resources.
- Answered 330 reference and 435 directional questions from Durham College students, faculty and staff at the Whitby Libary reference desk, over the phone and through email.

GATE COUNT

☐ Compared to last year, gate count numbers at Whitby Library continued to rise, with an increase from 2070 visitors in 2011-12 to 3,470 visitors in 2012-13.



NORTH OSHAWA LIBRARY COLLECTION HIGHLIGHTS Added over 1,600 NEW print books to the Durham College library collections (North Oshawa and Whitby). Purchased more than 1,300 new Ebsco NetLibrary ebooks, including new policing, nursing, graphic, business, computer and science ebooks. Acquired Library & Information Science Source. The content covers full-text for more than 430 journals. Evaluated and weeded 8,400 Durham College print books from the shelves. REFERENCE AND INSTRUCTION Delivered 180 information literacy classes at the North Oshawa location reaching over 5,900 Durham College students. Answered 3,260 reference questions from Durham College students and staff at the North Oshawa Libary reference desk, over the phone, and through email. Created video tutorials on using library resources. Developed a video tour of North Oshawa Library for the library's YouTube channel. **GATE COUNT** Compared to last year's total of 478,080 visitors, North Oshawa Library's gate count numbers continued to steadily rise with 489,100 visits in 2012-13. **CIRCULATION** Checked-out over 8,500 items to Durham College students, faculty and staff at the North Oshawa Library location.
