1. CALL TO ORDER

4. CONFLICT OF INTEREST DECLARATIONS

5. PRESENTATIONS

5.1 Construction and Hoisting Techniques Program video

D. Caron provided highlights of this 2-year old program offered at the Whitby Campus, noting the quality of teaching, equipment and simulators available to students. Training on use of tower crane is unique in Ontario. Graduates are in high demand in Ontario and beyond, especially Alberta. The Construction and Hoisting Techniques – Durham College video was screened.

5.2 Campus Safety

T. Lynch provided an overview of the active threat prevention and mitigation measures that have been taken by Durham College over the past few years to improve campus safety. Mitigation has been the initial primary focus; once well in hand, focus will shift more to prevention. Prevention measures to date include comprehensive student and employee stakeholder groups that are identifying possible threats and intervening before they are acted upon and more formal liaison with the Durham Regional Police Services and greater interaction with the on-campus Police Learning Centre are increasing response time and visibility.

The college has invested in mitigation measures such as dedicated on-campus public address system; social-media enabled communication systems; emergency response signage, training and testing; electronic access control systems which have greatly improved security.

In response to questions from Governors regarding assurance that our level of security is satisfactory, Tom noted that comparatively, across the post-secondary

sector and from his experience, we are a leader in security systems; regarding student awareness, he noted that the information is readily available on-line and in print and presented to students and staff and that we are working to ensure that accessibility requirements are being met; and, regarding potential challenges to students from emergency preparedness drills, that communications plans are in place to ensure that drills will not conflict with academic schedules and are not mistaken for real emergencies.

5.3 Whitby Campus Phase III Update

R. Aprile provided a presentation that included photographs, sketches and a dashboard snapshot of the progress of construction of the Centre for Food. He noted that we received a very strong response to the RFP for landscaping design; this initiative is generating significant interest beyond the Durham College community.

President Lovisa noted that Durham College has been welcomed to the Green Restaurant Association; this is group of restaurants across North America whose operations focus on both good business and good environmental stewardship. The College will now work toward Certified Green Restaurant ® status.

President Lovisa noted how valuable the visits to the various Institutes of Technology Ireland sites were in understanding the seamless system of academic laddering available to students that allows them to follow learning/credentialling paths from apprenticeship through to PhD. Linkages between academia, applied research, and entrepreneurs allow small and medium sized businesses access to technology, facilities, and intellectual resources that they could not otherwise afford, accelerating innovation and business development. President McTiernan added that they saw a strong focus on global business, with education, training and business support available in many languages in addition to English.

In relation to the President's Report, it was noted that President Lovisa's meeting with the Prime Minister and subsequent meeting with Minister Finlay and college presidents from across the country were well received and that the recommendations from the meeting with the Minister are being considered in Ottawa.
